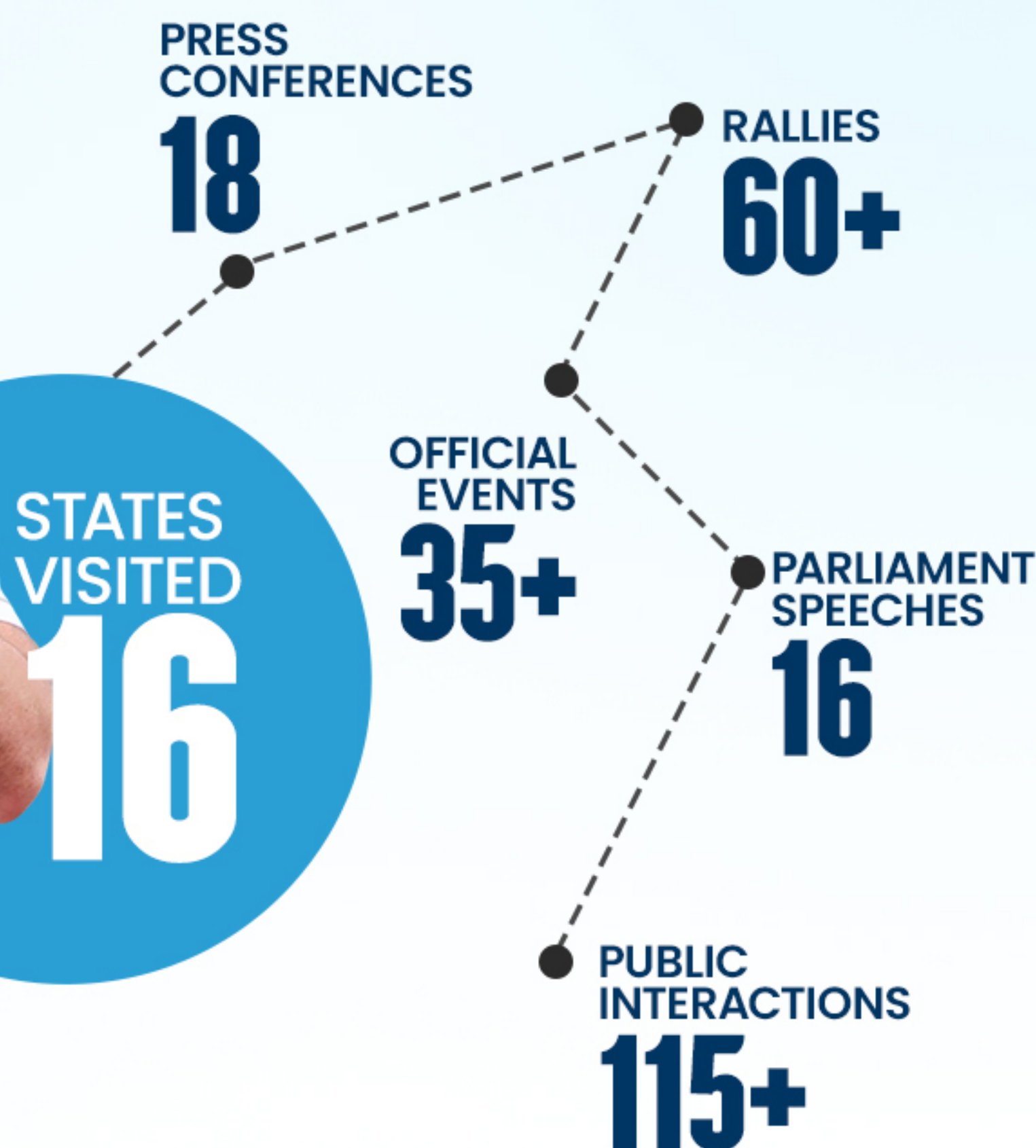
ONE YEAR AS LEADER OF OPPOSITION IN THE LOK SABHA

At the start of his tenure as Leader of Opposition, Rahul Gandhi said that being the LoP meant raising the voice of the people. Over the year, he has dedicated himself to protecting the Constitution and addressing people's concerns. His efforts have

ranged from advocating for a caste census to highlighting the Manipur violence and amplifying the voices of marginalised communities.

Rahul Gandhi's persistent advocacy compelled the government to conduct a nationwide caste census, withdraw a central government lateral entry notification, and implement President's Rule in Manipur.

As LoP, Rahul Gandhi has championed the voice of the people in Parliament, bringing to the forefront issues affecting all Indians, especially the 90%.



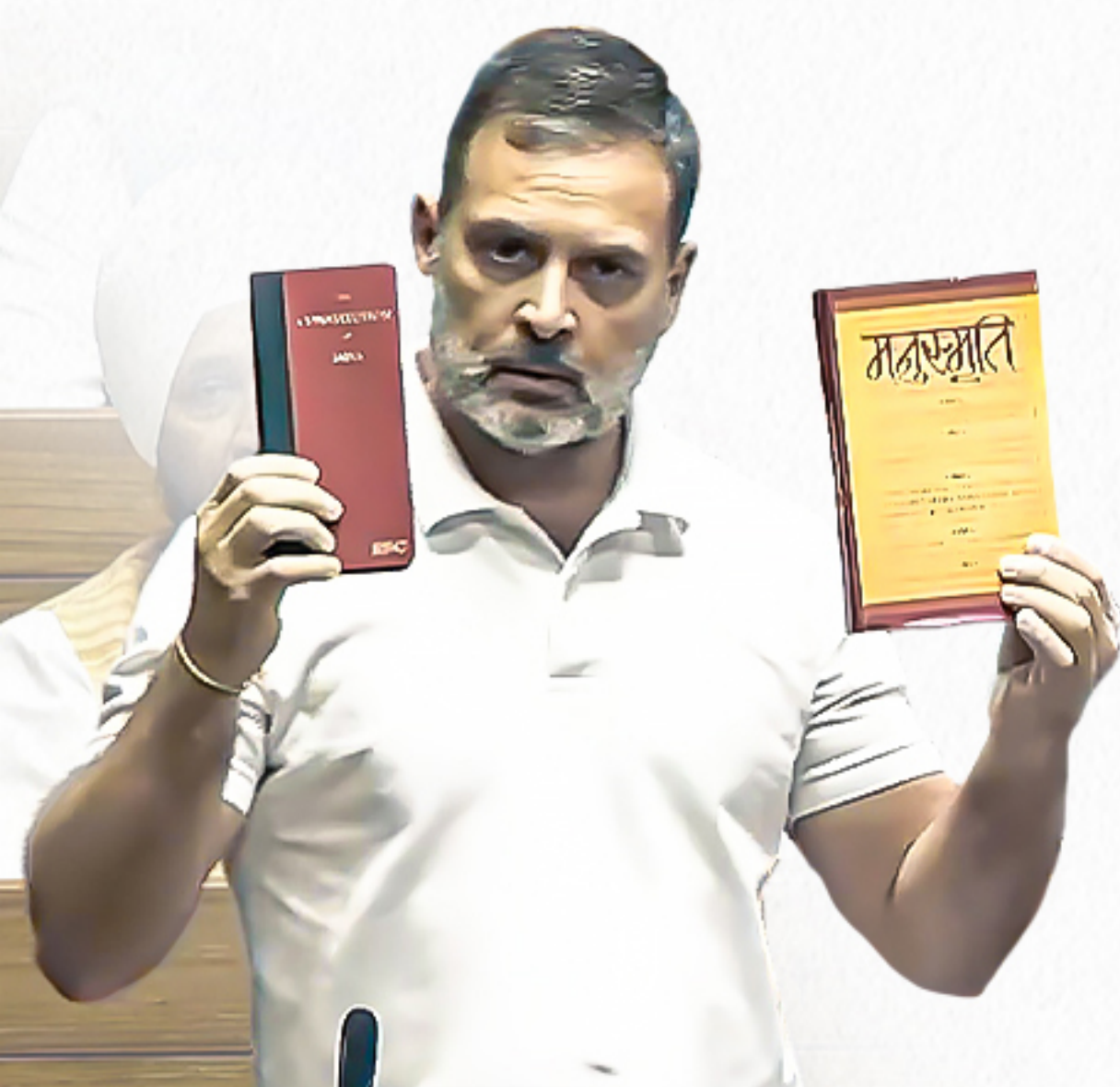

In his maiden speech in Parliament, Rahul Gandhi spoke about the politics of love and the fight for the Constitution that helped the INDIA bloc in its fight against the politics of hate. He emphasised how every religion in India preaches the same message: love and tolerance.



A Government that Works for the 90%

Speaking after the Budget 2024-25, Rahul Gandhi criticised the government for designing a budget that favoured billionaires. He emphasised that the Indian economy will only flourish when farmers, women and marginalised communities have a true share in it.



Constitution vs Manusmriti

In a speech commemorating 75 years of the Constitution, Rahul Gandhi spoke about the conflict between the Constitution and the Manusmriti. He spoke about how the BJP opposes the ideas of the Constitution and follows the Manusmriti—a text that promotes caste discrimination.

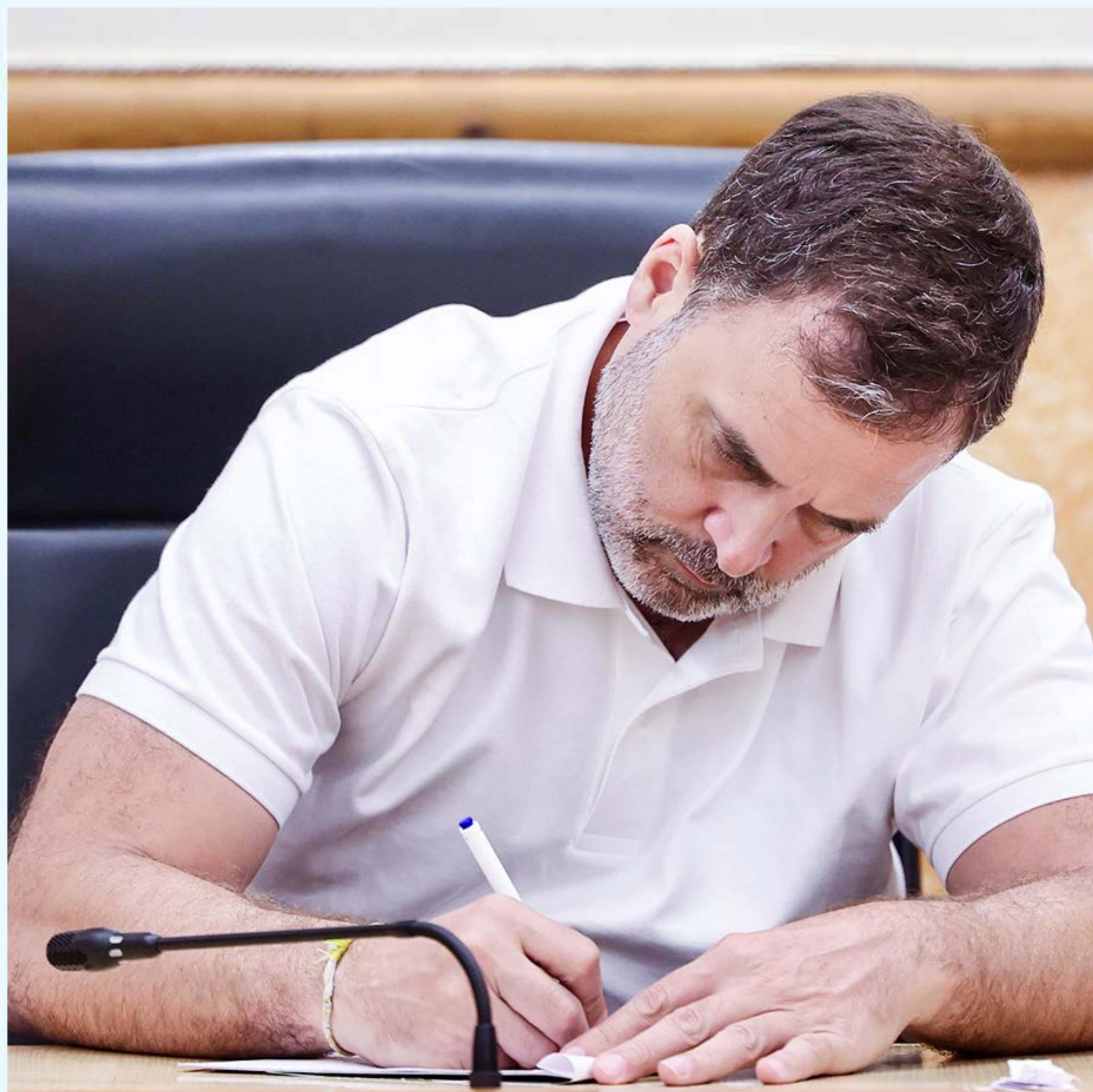


A New Vision for Indian Economy and Participation

Healthcare for All 🖱️

Rahul Gandhi wrote to the Union Health Minister, Mr. J.P. Nadda, about the need for better healthcare access and facilities across India and increased coverage in AYUSHMAN Bharat. He also requested Mr. Nadda and former Delhi Chief Minister, Ms. Atishi Singh, to provide shelters for poor patients who sleep outside AIIMS, New Delhi.

Nation Deserves Answers 🖱️

Following the Pahalgam terror attack, Operation Sindoor and ceasefire announced by US President Donald Trump, Rahul Gandhi, together with Kharge ji, wrote to PM Modi demanding a special session of Parliament.

Dignity for Anganwadi Workers 🖱️

Rahul Gandhi wrote to the Minister of Women and Child Development, Ms. Annpurna Devi, requesting an increase in the central government's share of honorarium and assistance for retiring Anganwadi workers and helpers to receive gratuity.

Making Universities a Safe Space for All 🖱️

Rahul Gandhi wrote to Chief Ministers of Congress-governed states in Karnataka, Telangana and Himachal Pradesh requesting them to lead by example by enacting the Rohith Vemula Act to eliminate caste-based discrimination in higher education institutions.

Preserving Coastal Livelihoods and Environment 🖱️

Rahul Gandhi wrote to PM Modi requesting cancellation of offshore mining tenders along Kerala, Gujarat and Andaman and Nicobar Islands' coasts, citing concerns about unassessed environmental impacts on marine life and fishermen's livelihood.

Never Letting the Truth Die

Meeting the family of the 2020 Hathras rape and murder victim, they shared how the UP government failed to fulfill its promises of relocation. Rahul Gandhi promised in Parliament that the INDIA bloc would relocate the family.



Peace for Manipur

Visiting refugee camps in Manipur, Rahul Gandhi criticised the Prime Minister for not visiting Manipur and failing to address the law and order situation. He extended his support to the people of Manipur and continues to raise their voice in Parliament.



Standing Against Terrorism

Extending support to injured victims, local Kashmiris and the J&K Congress party in Srinagar after the Pahalgam terror attack. He also visited Poonch to assess the damage caused by indiscriminate shelling from the Pakistani army and demanded a relief package for the people of Poonch.



Education for the 90%

During a Shiksha Nyay Samvaad in Bihar, Rahul Gandhi attempted to visit a Dalit hostel but was denied entry by the Bihar Police. He declared the move unconstitutional and designed to conceal the Bihar government's anti-Dalit stance.



On Track with Workers' Rights

Discussing loco pilots' challenging working conditions —denied bathroom breaks, forced to work 14-hour shifts, and made to operate in temperatures exceeding 40 degrees.





Prices Roar, Government Snores

Visiting a sabzi mandi in Delhi to discuss the rising prices of food & vegetables. Women at the sabzi mandi told Rahul Gandhi about the difficulties in running their households in today's economy.

Supporting Patients Outside AIIMS Delhi

Visiting patients and their families sleeping in the cold winter outside AIIMS Delhi. Rahul Gandhi spoke with patients who were forced to endure deplorable conditions without proper shelter, food or basic amenities.



Ambedkar's Voice is the Voice of Dalit youth

Talking to Dalit youth at a Dalit Yuva Samvad, in Rae Bareilly. Rahul Gandhi emphasised the importance of English education and pointed out how the RSS & BJP oppose it—despite their own children studying at foreign universities.
